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#### 1 INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 Introduction

This report and set of financial accounts is being compiled by the trustees of Stonehouse Heritage Group (SCO20826) to meet the requirements of the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator for the period 1<sup>st</sup> November 2020 to 31<sup>st</sup> October 2021.

#### 1.2 Background

Stonehouse Heritage Group was formed in 1991 and its aims and objectives are to research, collect and document all areas of heritage pertaining to Stonehouse and surrounding area and to make its findings public knowledge using standard means of leaflets and booklets, its website and group Facebook. It will also monitor current developments within the locality and by research and education provide a safeguard for the heritage of Stonehouse.

The organisation is open to anyone who has an interest in Stonehouse (Lanarkshire) and wishes to be involved in carrying out historical, genealogical / family history, research in any field concerning Stonehouse. The group will provide support in any research matter and may assist with funding with the only constraint being that the group receive a copy of the research and where we have provided funding the copyright is shared with the group and the group are acknowledged in any future publications.

The group is governed by its constitution which was amended and adopted at an Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM) held on 14<sup>th</sup> April 2008 due to comments by lottery awarding body "Awards for All" during a grant application process. More recently the group consulted with it members between October 2018 and October 2019 and at its AGM on 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2019 members agreed the revised constitution. This was then subsequently notified to OSCR and was accepted although the group should have consulted with OSCR prior to the change.

## 1.3 Executives and Sub Committees

#### **Grants Sub Committee**

No meetings held, however it was agreed that the Chair and any other member could make applications for grants provided they update members at the next available meeting. The Chair would continue to make applications to South Lanarkshire-Council (SLC) community grants fund whenever previous

grant expenditure was completed and confirmation of this was passed to SLC.

Applications were made to the following organisations for grant funding.

- SLC community grants scheme. Digitisation of School admission books.
- Stonehouse community council for a micro grant and was successful.

## Website Development -Sub Committee

Following the success of the Banks Kypemuir and SLC renewable energy fund grant applications, work has continued by Digital Routes Scotland who were engaged to work on the upgrade of the website. This has not been complete but has commenced.

The following is an outline of the work either completed or still ongoing.

- Census pages being split into individual census years. (Completed).
- Media drop down menu being created to include photo albums, audio and video. (Completed).
- New gallery which combines all the individual page galleries.
   (Completed).
- Headmasters diary log for Greenside school being digitised
- Townhead School in flip book format uploaded (Completed).
- War records for WW1 added (Complete)
- Pre WW1 records being prepared
- Ongoing for WW2
- School admissions records in excel added with a digital copy being made to be added at a later date. (Ongoing)
- FC School Log book being digitised for upload to site probably January 2022. (Ongoing)

### Oral History Sub committee

No meetings were held in the previous year, however oral history recording being added to website as part of the upgrade.

#### 2 Main Activities of the Group during 2020-2021

The group have not been able to meet physically since March 2020 and 2021 has been no different. The AGM was held by virtual means and access to this was made available to all members.

Zoom as a means of communicating with committee has been used throughout the year.

Work has continued on the website with school diaries being made available in a flip book format where each page can be turned. The main areas completed are outlined in section 1.3. The war records are proving to be more difficult as each individual WW1 enlistee requires a page to be created and then all information on the individual added to the page.



Planning for our 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary exhibition which was cancelled due to covid restrictions continues and provisional dates for 2022 have been set but need to be agreed with the local church. John young has prepared the exhibition boards and the new leaflet with committee members to read and make comment on them.

Two local walks were written and added to the Stonehouse Inside Out local app which gives visitors a virtual small walk round the village commencing from the cross area.

Funding from a £500 micro grant awarded from Stonehouse community council will allow the group to proceed with the scanning of the School admission log books which commence in 1880. The size of the books is proving to be more difficult as they span two A3 pages and need to be read as two pages. It is hoped that these will be available in February for upload to the website. These will be made available to the members only section of the site.

As reported last year Tom Gillespie has continued his work on recording all the Stonehouse Cemetery interments and gravestone inscriptions and are being compiled into a book which will be put on sale in the coming year. Tom is also compiling the full list of personnel who served in World War II.

School photographs by decade have now been added to the photo album section of the website and these have been put in chronological order and are continually updated throughout the year as additional names or photographs are passed to group members.

Facebook has been invaluable at obtaining additional names.

Membership of the group as of November 2020 was sitting at 58.

The AGM for 2021 is going to have to be a virtual meeting as opposed to being held locally in the presence of all attending members. Again all current members fully paid up members will be contacted and encouraged to attend the virtual meeting. Assistance will be offered to those not accustomed to using Zoom.
